In 2000 he was the subject of a This is Your Life on Channel 9.

Michael Carr-Gregg has extensive experience in the media and is currently a regular on the top rating 'Sunrise' program on Channel 7 and on Melbourne radio and is a frequent contributor to the Australian Print media.
